



History of the MSL Women's Division



The idea for the MSL Women's Division originated in the summer of 2006, during a conversation between MSL President, Larry Kolcz, and 2006 Chicago Gems' coach, Tony Feo. The MSL would offer a women's division, with all of the benefits and resources available to the men's league, if the Gems could put together at least four teams to create it. After several strategic discussions, a deal was made - the MSL and the Gems would team up to bring women's baseball back to Chicago! The Gems launched a massive recruiting, organizing and fundraising effort, adding more than 30 new players to build its player pool to the necessary size to form four teams. On April 1, the player draft was held and the MSL Women's Division was born. The MSL and the Gems hope that this will serve as a model for similar partnerships around the country, as women's teams commonly struggle to compete with men's leagues for access to fields and public support for their programs. The Chicago Gems want to thank Larry for his advice and support throughout this process. We look forward to a long partnership and the further development of the MSL Women's Division.
